







4	Showers?	<p>The only public showers are at Fred Benson Town Beach from late June to Labor Day.</p> <p>Some marinas have public showers, but you must contact the individual marina.</p>	
5	Lockers/Storage?	Lockers are located in the Visitors Center/Block Island Chamber building. They are single-use lockers. The size of every locker is 22" X 17" X 10".	

6	Garbage/Recycle?	<p>We appreciate an unlittered beach, there are garbage bins in front of the Island ferry ticket office, as well as in the restroom area of the chamber building. 8	Why is it called BLOCK Island?	Originally called Manisses (“Manitou’s Little Island”) by Narragansett Native Americans, the island was sighted by the Italian navigator Giovanni da Verrazzano in 1524 and later named for <u>Dutch explorer Adriaen Block</u> , who visited there in 1614. Settlers from Massachusetts arrived in 1661, and Block Island was admitted to the colony of Rhode Island three years later.	
9	Alcohol law?	Town ordinances prohibit open containers in all public places including beaches. Public drunkenness is a \$100 fine and the fine for open containers is \$75.	
10	Rent beach equipment and water activities? 11	Vehicle parking on island?	There is no paid parking on the island. Some trailheads and beaches have parking available.	

12	Who is Rebecca the statue?	<p>Named for the Bible's Rebekah-at-the-well, Block Island's own "Rebecca" stands at the center of the Old Harbor traffic circle. This iconic Block Island lady was put in place in 1896 by the local Women's Christian Temperance Movement, which hoped to curb the consumption of alcohol on Block Island. Temperance fountains were installed in hundreds of communities. The idea was to offer clean water as a healthier option to the ubiquitous refresher of the time, beer. Restoration experts have concluded that Rebecca is in fact Hebe, cupbearer to the Gods at Mt. Olympus, also goddess of youth and the wife of Hercules. Hebe was said to have diluted the wine she was tasked to serve. The white statue was recast in 2001, and it still succeeds in reminding us to consider the negative effects of alcohol consumption.</p>

18	Beach fires?	Permits are issued the day of the fire, and only allowed per the Fire Chief's consent as long as there are permissible weather conditions. They are obtained at the Police Station. Be sure to bring a valid driver's license or picture identification. The person filling out the permit is responsible for having the fire completely extinguished by Midnight and the removal of all litters and refuses from permit area. Please note, permits may be rescinded at any time due to adverse weather conditions.
